



Alexandre de Streeel, Professor, Namur University and Research Fellow, Centre on Regulation in Europe (CERRE)

Alexandre de Streeel is Professor of European law at the University of Namur in Belgium and the Director of the Research Centre for Information, Law and Society (CRIDS), focusing his research on Regulation and Competition Law in the network industries. He is also Research Fellow at the Centre on Regulation in Europe (CERRE) in Brussels and member of the Scientific Committee of the Florence School of Regulation (FSR) at the European University Institute in Florence. He is also an Assessor (member of the decisional body) at the Belgian Competition Authority.

Previously, he has been European advisor in charge of the European Council to the Belgian Deputy Prime Minister, counsellor in charge of economic and employment policies at the Belgian Permanent Representation to the European Union during the 2010 Belgian Presidency, and an expert in charge of telecommunications regulation at the European Commission, DG Communications Networks, Content and Technology.

He holds a Ph.D. in Law from the European University Institute (Florence) on the relationship between telecom regulation and competition law, and a Master Degree in Economics from the University of Louvain.
